Dear parents and caregivers,

At present we have experienced growth in our schools student numbers and due to this we are looking at employing an additional teacher for Term 3 and 4 this year. The Ministry have guaranteed our teacher numbers until the end of the school year but I am unsure at present if these numbers will in fact lead to a full-time teacher for next year. I personally am hoping that we have passed the 'magic number' to have 7 full-time classrooms for the next school year and if this is the case all our classes will certainly have lower numbers. I have advertised the position in the lastest Gazette so am hoping that we will have suitable applicants apply. Depending on the person/s who apply, will depend on the exact makeup of the class/es for the rest of the school year. Please be assured that the decision/s that are made will be in the best interests of education for the students involved.

We are entering the last part of 10 year funding from the Ministry and the Board, along with the staff, have looked at the best way in which we can move the school forward. We are planning to alter the space between Room 4 and 5 so that there are glass bi-folding doors that can be opened up and allow more room for both of the classes. Looking forward to the possibility of having 7 classes, we are turning the largest room in the school, the library, back into a classroom. This way we do have another full-time classroom for next term/next year. Due to this we are looking at redeveloping The Hub into the Library. With careful positioning of shelves and utilising the space that we have there this will be a more efficient use of space.

Within the next 7 - 10 months the Board and Teachers will be developing the next 5/10 year plan for the buildings. This will then go to the Ministry for approval and we will continue the development of our school into a learning environment for our children.
